

# ACM Hackathon Information

## Prompt

The prompt for this hackathon is relatively simple and open ended: **create a generator**. Your program can generate text, stories, images, maps, or pretty much anything that you can imagine; the prompt is quite flexible and can be stretched to accommodate many different and creative ideas.

## General Rules

You may participate in this hackathon alone or in teams of up to 3 people. Additionally, your program may be created using any programming language.

To submit your program, you may upload your program file(s) to GitHub and then submit the GitHub repository link to a submission form which will be sent out at a later time.

In addition to your program, you will also need to create a brief presentation explaining the idea behind your program, what your program generates, and how it generates it.

The hackathon runs for two weeks, from Tuesday, October 31st to Tuesday, November 14th. Our meeting on November 14th will wrap up our hackathon, giving you the opportunity to present about your program. Your program and presentation will be judged by a panel of professors on the criteria listed in the rubric below.
